

# 2020 Euro Masters Regatta

## Important CoVid19 safety and hygiene instructions for international participants

### Prior to making entries

**1. Please check first whether you are allowed to enter Germany at all:**

- Do you have a permanent residence in Germany? -> *Yes, entry allowed*
- Are you a citizen of Germany, the EU, Great Britain, Switzerland, Liechtenstein, Norway or Iceland? -> *Yes, entry allowed*
- Do you live in Australia, Georgia, Canada, New Zealand, Thailand, Tunisia or Uruguay? -> *Yes, entry allowed*

**2. When you are allowed to enter Germany, please check the quarantine regulations:**

- Should you enter from a risk area, you can avoid quarantine by testing: You will need a medical certificate in German or English language confirming that there is no evidence of infection with the Corona virus SARS-CoV-2 and that it is not older than 48 hours when you enter Germany.

**3. Make sure to book accommodation that can be cancelled at short notice.**

### Prior to travelling to Munich

As a participant, you must complete an electronic health questionnaire at least three days before the first race day of the regatta. The questionnaire will be available via the registration portal at <https://max.regatta.de>. The following information will be requested and stored until 14 days after the last race day of the regatta and then deleted:

- Surname, first name, address, phone number und e-mail address
- Countries visited in the previous 14 days
- If one of the following points applies (reference period: past 14 days):
  - Visits to risk areas - these include countries or regions outside Germany for which there is an increased risk of infection with the Corona virus SARS-CoV-2 at the time of entry into Germany; please check the most recent risk area published by Robert Koch Institute [here](#) (as of 21.8.2020)
  - Contact with Covid-19 infected persons
  - Voluntary or forced quarantine
  - Positive Covid-19 test
  - Detection of some of the following symptoms:  
fever, cough, fatigue, shortness of breath, muscle aches, sore throat, chest pain, cold, headache, chills, nausea, diarrhoea, loss of smell or taste (if so, name applicable symptoms)

The questionnaire is linked to a QR code, which you have to bring along as a printed copy or on your smartphone.

**Participants include all athletes, coaches, drivers, judges, volunteers, service providers, merchants and employees.  
Spectators are not admitted to the 2020 Euro Masters Regatta!**

If your answers indicate an increased risk of infection, we must unfortunately exclude you from the 2020 Euro Masters Regatta.

## At the venue during the race days

By an optimized schedule, we ensure it does not get crowded at the launching and boat storage areas. In addition, the buildings and facilities are continuously cleaned and disinfected. In order to guarantee your safety at the venue during the regatta, the rules as follows apply. We are counting on you to comply with the requests of our regatta team and to show respect and solidarity to each other. Thank you in advance!

- **Admission controls**
  - Each time you enter the venue you must identify yourself with a QR code. You will receive this QR code online (you can also print it out) when you have completed your digital health questionnaire. The QR code will be scanned and the information verified.
  - Attention: Admission without delay is only possible if you have submitted the digital health questionnaire in time and there is no doubt that you do not carry a potential infection risk (see above!)
- **Rules of conduct at the regatta venue for both outside areas and in buildings**
  - A minimum distance of 1.50 m must be maintained throughout the entire venue. If this is not possible, a mouth-nose cover must be worn. We recommend that you always wear a mouth-nose cover on land, regardless of the minimum distance.
  - In buildings including all boat sheds you are required to always wear a mouth-nose cover. Please put the cover on before entering the building.
  - Please comply with the usual personal anti-Corona hygiene rules throughout the venue. This includes in particular regular washing your hands regularly (with soap, for at least 30 seconds) and sneezing/coughing in the crook of your arm. For hand disinfection we provide you with disinfectant.
  - As we strive to protect all parties involved, we unfortunately cannot accept medical certificates regarding a waiver of the mouth-nose cover.
  - Please note: Unfortunately we have to be strict. In case of willful violation of the hygiene concept we reserve the right to exclude the rowers from the regatta.
- **Information center:**
  - A maximum of four persons may enter the information center at the same time. The waiting area with distance markings is located in front of the building.
  - Before entering, please disinfect your hands and put on your mouth-nose cover.
  - Alternatively, you can reach the information center at any time during the opening hours by e-mail ([info@regatta.de](mailto:info@regatta.de)) or by phone to reduce personal contacts.
  - Attention: crew changes are only possible online via [max.regatta.de](http://max.regatta.de).
  - Race results and current information can be found online at [carsten.regatta.de](http://carsten.regatta.de)
- **Weigh-in:**
  - During weigh-in, you must wear your mouth-nose cover. Only one team at a time may enter the weigh-in area. The waiting area is located outside of the building.
- **Pontoons:**
  - While training or racing on the water, there is of course no need to wear a mouth-nose cover. Once you reach the pontoons, please cover up again.
  - To maintain the minimum distance, the number of people on the pontoons is limited. There will be three pontoons each for launching and landing. Please follow the instructions of the control commission.
- **Victory ceremony:**
  - Have you won your race? Congratulations! We honor you contactlessly at the winner's pontoon. You will receive your medals on a tray. Please do not get out of the boat to maintain the distance!
  - Only the winning team may land at the winner's pontoon. From the land side, only responsible staff is allowed on the pontoon. Coaches or external photographers must not enter the pontoon.

## At the venue during the race days (continued)

- **Restrooms, changing rooms and showers:**
  - As of August 21, 2020 we will open changing rooms and showers. However, please be aware that current local regulations at the time of the regatta may force us to close the changing rooms and showers.
  - In changing rooms, toilets and showers please keep a minimum distance of 1.5m and wear a mouth-nose cover (exception: during showering). This means that you have to wait outside if there is a big crowd, especially at the showers because we have to close every other to keep the minimum distances!
  - Toilets and showers are cleaned regularly with disinfectant.
- **Team tents:**
  - Team tents may only be set up on the campsite at a distance of 3 m from each other. Only the participants of the particular team are allowed to stay there with a maximum of 10 persons in total.
- **Food and beverages / market place:**
  - During the regatta there will be food trucks offering take-away food. Please ensure a minimum distance of 1.5 m in queues and wear a mouth-nose cover.
  - The same applies to the market place with exhibitors, boat builders and accessory suppliers.

## After the regatta

- If CoVid19 disease symptoms occur during your stay in Munich or within 14 days after your departure, you are obliged to inform us immediately ([infectionprevention@regatta.de](mailto:infectionprevention@regatta.de)).
- In case of a confirmed infection during or within 14 days after the regatta, we will inform all affected persons about this case in consultation with the authorities.

## Independent action and liability

- Regatta München e.V. works on the basis of a comprehensive hygiene and safety concept, which is based on the applicable official regulations. The risk of an infection with Covid-19 can be reduced considerably, but it cannot be excluded completely.
- Each participant must decide for himself or herself whether he or she feels sufficiently safe and able to take part in the regatta based on the measures taken.
- Regatta München e.V. is not liable for any infections during or around the regatta.

**Even if this all sounds very bureaucratic and exhausting, it serves all our health!**
